JULY 26 - FEAST OF SAINT ANNE AND SAINT JOACHIM, PARENTS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY: Devotion to Saint Anne existed in the 6th century in the Church of Constantinople and early in the 8th century in Rome. Popular devotion increased in the 13th and 14th centuries, as seen by the number of Churches bearing her name. At the request of some English Bishops who were petitioned by parishioners, Pope Urban VI made her feast an annual celebration. Joachim has been honoured in the East from earliest days, but in the West only since the 16th century. The names of Saint Anne and Saint Joachim were entered into the Roman calendar in 1584.

<u>JULY 29 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MARTHA, DISCIPLE OF THE LORD:</u> Martha was the sister of Mary and Lazarus, and all three were friends of Jesus. They lived in Bethany, three kilometres from Jerusalem. It was Martha who received Jesus into her house and served the guests while her sister Mary sat at the Lord's feet, listening to his teaching. Martha is a model of hospitality as well as of fidelity in discipleship. She is the patroness of housewives and of waiters and waitresses.

July 30 - Memorial of Saint Peter Chrysologus, Bishop, Doctor: Peter was born in Italy around 406 and became Archbishop about 439. When he arrived in his diocese, he found a strong pagan influence and many lapsed faithful. Through his labours, paganism was eradicated and the faith revived. He was a concerned pastor and preacher and earned the title 'Chrysologus' meaning 'of golden words' because of his inspirational homilies. He died around 450 and was made a Doctor of the Church in 1729.

JULY 31 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA, PRIEST:

Ignatius Loyola was born in 1491 and at the age of 30, during a long convalescent period, he read about the life of Christ as well as the lives of many saints, and found himself inflamed with the desire to serve Jesus. He earned a master's degree from the University of Paris and eventually gathered together a group of students, including Francis Xavier, with whom he shared his eagerness for wholehearted service of Jesus. They formed the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) and, while his companions were sent on missions, Ignatius spent the rest of his life directing the rapidly growing order, writing its constitutions, and refining the Spiritual Exercises which resulted from his mystical experiences and illuminations experienced during life. He died in 1556, was canonized in 1622, and is a universal patron of retreats and soldiers.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today we hear the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish as presented in John's Gospel. A number of key points of faith come to mind. We learn that God is a life-giving God, who cares for hungering crowds, and we connect with the Eucharist. We are reminded that God feeds and nourishes us, fulfilling our physical and spiritual needs every time we receive Christ's Body and Blood. We are also reminded that each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are anticipating the Eternal Banquet of Heaven. In the Eucharist too, we come to the realization that we ourselves are being transformed and called to go forth from the Mass to serve others – the poor, the hungry, the lost, the wounded – just as Jesus did. By reaching out to those in need, the miracle of the loaves and fish continues through us.
