Nevertheless, many people, including many Christians, know little about the core beliefs and practices of this tradition which, as the third of the Abrahamic religions, shares much in common with Christianity. Indeed, popular media portrayals of Islam continue to fuel misunderstandings. This session is designed to help participants understand and appreciate the religious beliefs and practices of the vast majority of Muslims, who detest violence and terrorism as much as any typical Christian and Canadian. It will also address some of the factors involved in the rise of radical Islam in today's global society.

24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings focus on the importance of forgiveness. In the Penitential Act, at the beginning of every Mass, the Priest invites us to "acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries". Then there is a period of silence which provides time to reflect on one's sins. We then acknowledge our sins and the rite ends with a prayer for God's mercy. Whether it be on a personal level by means of the Sacrament of Reconciliation or on a communal level during Mass, time and time again we ask God for forgiveness and we are mercifully forgiven. Following the example of God's compassionate readiness to forgive us, we in turn are called, as disciples of the Lord Jesus, to be always ready to forgive others, not just in words but from our heart. Each time we pray "The Lord's Prayer" we ask God to "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us" — we ask God to forgive us to the extent that we forgive others. This is food for thought. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that there should be no limit to our readiness to forgive. In imitation of God's boundless generosity, let us always be ready to forgive, thus building up God's Kingdom of love and peace at home, in our church communities, and among all people.

Many parishioners have been questioning what is happening with the huge amount of money that was raised from our first Chase The Ace lottery. On our application, for the licence for this event, we stated that the earnings would be used for maintenance of parish properties, children's programs and miscellaneous parish needs.

Parish council decided that the bulk of this money will be used for needed church repairs - such as replacing the exterior storm windows of the church. The stained glass would be left intact. The Parish council received no bids for this tender so it was decided to wait and re-tender the project later. The money is being put aside for the eventuality that we find a successful bidder for a future tender. Parish council decided that, until further assessment, future Chase the Ace lotteries will become our regular parish Fundraiser - as was the case of our Wednesday night bingos in the past.

Municipal Elections: The advance poll for municipal elections takes place on Wednesday, Sept. 20th here in our community. The general election will take place on Tuesday, Sept. 26th at the firehall.
