<u>March 4 - Memorial of Saint Casimir</u>: Casimir, the son of Casimir IV, King of Poland, was born in Krakow in 1458. His grandfather, Wladislaus II Jagiello, was responsible for introducing Christianity into Poland. Educated by a very devout priest, Casimir felt called to a life devoted to God and so he rejected the trappings of royalty for a simple humble life. He was directly involved in government affairs and was renowned for his sense of justice and his care for the poor. Casimir is often depicted in artwork as having three hands, reflecting his reputation for extraordinary charity. He died of tuberculosis when he was 26 and was buried in Lithuania. Casimir is the patron saint of Lithuania and one of the patrons of Poland.

March 7 - Memorial of Saint Perpetua and Saint Felicity, Martyrs:

Perpetua, a young noblewoman, and Felicity, a slave, were killed for their faith on March 7, 203. During the persecution of Christians by Emperor Severus early in the third century, several catechumens were arrested, among them Perpetua with her infant son, and Felicity who was pregnant at the time. Both women were baptized while under arrest and, refusing to renounce their faith, they – along with several other Christians – were flogged, led to the amphitheatre, exposed to the wild beasts, and beheaded. Their martyrdom offers a very powerful example of the new world created by the birth of Christianity.

<u>March 8 - Memorial of Saint John of God, Religious</u>: John was born in Portugal on March 8, 1495. Having worked in various occupations for a number of years, he was eventually overcome by guilt because of his wasted life and sought the counsel of John of Avila who helped him find a new purpose in life. John of God then dedicated himself to the care of the sick and the poor. Others joined him and they became known as the Brothers of St. John of God. John died on his birthday in 1550 and was canonized in 1690. He is a patron of hospitals and the sick.

March 9 - Memorial of Saint Frances of Rome, Religious: Frances was born in 1384 in Rome. She was happily married and had three children. The death in infancy of two of her children taught Frances compassion for others who were grieving and less fortunate. She took food to the poor and visited the sick and the needy. Frances gathered other women who lived a life of prayer and cared for others, and founded a community of Benedictine Oblates. When her husband died, Frances joined their community. She died in 1440 and was declared a saint in 1608. She is a patroness of widows.

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

In today's Gospel, Jesus is in Jerusalem because the Passover of the Jews is near. This sacred feast draws numerous pilgrims who come to celebrate this great feast. However, what Jesus encounters in the Temple area is a complete contradiction of that for which the Temple is intended. The Temple, the House of God, was designed to be used for prayer, not as a marketplace or some other commercial undertaking. Jesus shows passionate devotion for his Father's house when he overturns the tables, sending people, animals, and coins scurrying in all directions. Then, when the religious leaders ask for a sign which will account for Jesus' reaction, they are unable to see with the eyes of faith that Jesus' reference to the destruction of the Temple and its been raised up in three days is actually a reference to his own death and resurrection. May we always walk with faith and not depend on signs to believe in God's saving power at work in our lives.
