LENTEN SEASON

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts until the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper which marks the start of the Easter Triduum. Lent is the yearly celebration by the Church of its corporate conversion in Jesus Christ. It has a twofold purpose: it helps catechumens to prepare for celebrating the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion) at the Easter Vigil, and it invites those who are baptized to prepare through penance and prayer to renew their baptismal vows at Easter. Thus, Lent recalls or prepares for Baptism and emphasizes a spirit of penance. The baptismal and penitential themes are reflected in the Lenten readings.

MARCH 2 - ASH WEDNESDAY: On this day we begin our lenten journey. Ash Wednesday is a universal day of fasting and of abstinence from meat. As Catholics, we observe the lenten fast by limiting ourselves to one full meal and two smaller meals. The law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age. The law of abstinence from meat binds those who are 14 and older.

MARCH4-WORLD DAY OF PRAYER: This day is sponsored by the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada and its national counterparts around the world. It is celebrated in over 170 countries and is observed annually on the first Friday in March. World Day of Prayer is an invitation for Christians to pause and pray together ecumenically. This recalls our Christian responsibility to be sensitive to the signs of the times so that we might bring a more authentically Christian dimension to the concerns of our world, our country, and our community.

<u>Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 7:00 p.m.</u> St. Ignatius Church

Because of caution around the spread of Covid-19, changes have been approved by the Bishop with regard to how ashes will be distributed on Ash Wednesday. They are as follows:

After blessing the ashes and sprinkling them with holy water in silence, the priest will address those present, reciting **once** the formula found in the Roman Missal: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return". The procession to receive the ashes will follow as we do for the Eucharist with the right side beginning the procession. The priest will cleanse his hands, put on a face mask, and using a different swab for each person the ashes will be placed on each person's forehead without saying anything further.

During the procession please ensure you are maintaining a 6 ft distance.
