

Special Days This Week:

OCTOBER 15 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT TERESA OF JESUS (SAINT TERESA OF AVILA), VIRGIN, DOCTOR: Teresa (1515-1582) was born in Avila, Spain. She is one of the many women who exercised leadership roles in the Church. She founded the reformed (Discalced) Carmelite orders of nuns and friars. She wrote several works which are considered classics of spiritual literature, including *The Way of Perfection* and *The Interior Castle*. A great mystic, and a strong, intelligent and active leader in the Church, Teresa was canonized in 1622 and became the first woman to be declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970. She is patroness of Spain.

OCTOBER 16 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MARGUERITE D'YOUVILLE, RELIGIOUS: Marie-Marguerite was born in Varennes, Quebec, on October 15, 1701. She married in 1722 but her husband died eight years later, leaving her with enormous debts. When she had overcome her financial difficulties, Marguerite rented a house in Montreal in 1737 where she and three companions, the first Grey Nuns, sheltered needy women. In 1747, Marguerite was given charge of the colony's general hospital which was deep in debt. Trusting in Providence, she worked hard and saved the hospital. In 1765, fire destroyed the hospital, but Marguerite rebuilt it within four years. She died in 1771, was declared blessed in 1959, and was canonized in 1990. She is the first Canadian-born saint.

OCTOBER 17 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH, BISHOP, MARTYR: Ignatius was Bishop of Antioch for 40 years. He was arrested during a time of persecution, condemned for confessing Christ, and brought in chains to Rome. While on this journey, Ignatius dictated seven letters on Church matters which are counted among the treasures of early Christianity. When he arrived in Rome in 107, he was taken directly to the amphitheatre where lions devoured him.

OCTOBER 18 - FEAST OF SAINT LUKE, EVANGELIST: Luke, a physician, is the author of the third Gospel and of the Acts of the Apostles. He was undoubtedly a Gentile Christian and he wrote for other Gentiles who did not have the background of the Old Testament in which to root their faith. His writings show him to be an educated man with considerable literary skill. Saint Luke is a patron of the medical profession.

October 19 - Memorial of Saint Paul of the Cross, Priest: Born in northern Italy in 1694, Paul experienced conversion at 15 years of age and began a lifetime of devotion to prayer and austerity. Known as Paul of the

28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's Gospel, the focus is on discipleship. Though the rich man had kept all the commandments since his youth, he felt the need to do more. However, because his wealth had too much of a hold over him, he was unable to part with his riches so as to follow Jesus more deeply. His earthly possessions proved to be a great obstacle to growth in his relationship with God. Wealth in this Gospel can stand for anything that can deter us from following Christ more deeply. Our relationship with God must be our prime relationship, the one which gives meaning to all our other relationships. Though the commandments are a framework for living out our faith, we are called to action in our daily lives. Our riches, be they in the form of material wealth or talents or time, are to be placed at the service of the Kingdom of God – for the praise and glory of God and for the good of one another.

The Church is concerned about the issue of hunger in the world, remembering the words of Christ, "... I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink . . ." (*Matthew 25.35*). Pope John Paul II, in his 2003 Message, says, "People are becoming increasingly aware of the need to unify aims and actions, as is the Church, which shares the hopes and sufferings of humanity. She (the Church) is anxious to make her contribution to a solution that meets the expectations of each person."
