JULY 29 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MARTHA, DISCIPLE OF THE LORD:

Martha was the sister of Mary and Lazarus, and all three were friends of Jesus. They lived in Bethany, three kilometres from Jerusalem. It was Martha who received Jesus into her house and served the guests while her sister Mary sat at the Lord's feet, listening to his teaching. Martha is a model of hospitality as well as of fidelity in discipleship. She is the patroness of housewives and of waiters and waitresses.

July 30 - Saint Peter Chrysologus, Bishop, Doctor: Peter was born in Italy around 406 and became Archbishop about 439. When he arrived in his diocese, he found a strong pagan influence and many lapsed faithful. Through his labours, paganism was eradicated and the faith revived. He was a concerned pastor and preacher and earned the title 'Chrysologus' meaning 'of golden words' because of his inspirational homilies. He died around 450 and was made a Doctor of the Church in 1729.

<u>August 2 - Memorial of Saint Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop:</u> Born in Sardinia in the year 283, Eusebius became the first bishop in Vercelli, Italy. Along with St. Athanasius, he affirmed the divinity of Christ against the Arian heresy which denied it. As a result of his defence of Christ's divinity, Eusebius was banished to Palestine. However, in 361 he was able to return to his diocese in Vercelli where he died in 371.
