

JULY 29 - MEMORIAL OF SAINTS MARTHA, MARY AND LAZARUS,

DISCIPLES OF THE LORD: In the 2021 Decree on the celebration of Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus, the Congregation for Divine Worship said, “In the household of Bethany the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that he loved them. Martha generously offered him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to his words and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb

July 30 - Memorial of Saint Peter Chrysologus, Bishop, Doctor: Peter was born in Italy around 406 and became Archbishop about 439. When he arrived in his diocese, he found a strong pagan influence and many lapsed faithful. Through his labours, paganism was eradicated and the faith revived. He was a concerned pastor and preacher and earned the title ‘Chrysologus’ meaning ‘of golden words’ because of his inspirational homilies. He died around 450 and was made a Doctor of the Church in 1729. at the command of the One who humiliated death.”

JULY 31 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA, PRIEST:

Ignatius Loyola was born in 1491 and at the age of 30, during a long convalescent period, he read about the life of Christ, as well as the lives of many saints, and found himself inflamed with the desire to serve Jesus. He earned a master’s degree from the University of Paris and eventually gathered together a group of students, including Francis Xavier, with whom he shared his eagerness for wholehearted service of Jesus. They formed the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) and, while his companions were sent on missions, Ignatius spent the rest of his life, directing the rapidly growing order. He died in 1556, was canonized in 1622, and is a universal patron of retreats and soldiers.

AUGUST 1 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT ALPHONSUS LIGUORI, BISHOP,

DOCTOR: Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787) was born in Naples and demonstrated intellectual ability at an early age. He first became a doctor of civil law at age 17, but in 1726 he was ordained. He founded an order of mission priests which became the Redemptorists and was known for his great kindness and concern for others. In 1762 he became a Bishop. He was canonized in 1839 and was named a Doctor of the Church in 1871. He is the patron of moral theologians and confessors.

August 2 - Memorial of Saint Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop: Born in Sardinia in the year 283, Eusebius became the first bishop in Vercelli, Italy. Along with St. Athanasius, he affirmed the divinity of Christ against the Arian heresy which denied it. As a result of his defence of Christ’s divinity, Eusebius was banished to Palestine. However, in 361 he was able to return to his diocese in Vercelli where he died in 371.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today we hear the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish as presented in John’s Gospel. A number of key points of faith come to mind. We learn that God is a life-giving God, who cares for hungry crowds, and we connect with the Eucharist. We are reminded that God feeds and nourishes us, fulfilling our physical and spiritual needs every time we receive Christ’s Body and Blood. We are also reminded that each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are anticipating the Eternal Banquet of Heaven. In the Eucharist too, we come to the realization that we ourselves are being transformed and called to go forth from the Mass to serve others – the poor, the hungry, the lost, the wounded – just as Jesus did. By reaching out to those in need, the miracle of the loaves and fish continues through us.
