May 18 - Memorial of Saint John I, Pope, Martyr: John I became Pope in 523. At this time Italy was ruled by Theodoric the Goth, who had reversed his policy of tolerance toward Christians because of trouble between Rome and the emperor of Constantinople. When his subjects appealed to him, Theodoric organized a delegation to negotiate with the emperor and ordered a reluctant Pope John to head the mission and to act as mediator between Rome and Constantinople. John did win some concessions, but Theodoric was not satisfied. The Pope and his entourage were imprisoned and John died soon after, probably of starvation.

<u>May 20 - Memorial of Saint Bernardine of Siena, Priest:</u> Born in 1380 into a noble family, Bernadine was orphaned at age seven and raised by loving relatives who provided him with an excellent education. In 1402 he entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained in 1404. Commissioned to preach, Bernardine won converts all over northern and central Italy. A true son of Saint Francis, Bernardine died in 1444 and was canonized in 1450.

<u>May 21 - Memorial of Saint Eugène de Mazenod, Bishop:</u> Born in France in 1782, Charles Joseph Eugène de Mazenod was ordained in 1811. He founded the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, a missionary institute of priests and lay brothers, whose particular charism is to minister to those who have never heard of Christ. Their presence extended to Canada where they established the College of Bytown (now the University of Ottawa and St. Paul University) and Novalis, as well as numerous parishes and dioceses from coast to coast. Eugène was superior of the Oblates until his death on May 21, 1861. He was canonized on December 3, 1995. Today, the members of the Oblate community work around the world.

May 21 - Memorial of Saint Christopher Magallanes, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs: Born in Mexico in 1869, Christopher Magallanes entered the seminary at age 19. After ordination, he and his companions worked with the poor and the indigenous people of Mexico. In the 1920's, the anti-Catholic government in Mexico closed all seminaries and Father Christopher started his own seminary, but it was soon forced to close. He opened another, and another, and finally conducted classes in private homes. He was arrested on May 21, 1927, while on his way to celebrate Mass and was falsely accused of promoting armed rebellion. He was executed four days later, along with 21 diocesan priests and 3 laymen. Before his martyrdom, he forgave his executioners. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2000.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER
